


Fundamental Principles of a Meaningful Vision Zero Commitment

These principles are core to successful Vision Zero efforts.


- Traffic deaths and severe injuries are acknowledged to be preventable.
- 2. Human life and health are prioritized within all aspects of the transportation system.
- 3. Acknowledgment that human error is inevitable, and transportation systems should be forgiving.
- 4. Safety work should focus on systems-level changes above influencing individual behavior.
- Mitigation of speed is recognized and prioritized as the fundamental factor in crash severity.

Vision Zero Action Plan Update Actions

- 1. Develop and implement DOTI safety policies
- 2. Create and Implement Safety Focus Area Plans
- 3. Develop a Citywide Speed Reduction Team
- 4. Develop a Citywide Crash Management Team
- 5. Develop a Citywide Safety Evaluation Program
- 6. Work with DOTI's Transit Program to couple transit investments with safety improvements to strategically transform the HIN

Vision Zero Action Plan Update Actions

- 7. Increase use of traffic safety cameras (speed and red-light cameras)
- 8. Create "car-free zone" and "slow zone" implementation guide
- 9. Develop a safety quick-build remediation program
- 10. Support build-out of the pedestrian, cyclist, micromobility and transit user network
- 11. Create a multimodal safety curriculum for K-12th grade
- 12. Targeted community engagement and dialogue
- 13. Support community led place making and traffic calming initiatives
- 14. Make the City and County of Denver as a government agency a model Vision Zero adopter










Neighborhood Schools

- Continue to build relationships and partnerships with Denver Public Schools and other programs with co-benefits
- Explore standardized school zone infrastructure treatments and develop an implementation plan to bring all schools to the future standard
