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Confirming understanding of program expectations (Check to confirm understanding)

- This is a technical assistance award and grant program. If accepted to the program, grantees will meet monthly by phone with a coach from the Safe Routes Partnership to work through the Safe Routes to Parks action framework. Additional peer learning opportunities will be available as well.
- Grantees will receive \$12,500 to begin implementing the action plan.
- Grantees will develop an action plan that follows the stages of the Safe Routes to Parks action framework. This is a grant deliverable, but it is intended for use and benefit of grantee organization.

Grantees can focus their work on one park, but will be encouraged to think about how to apply Safe Routes to Parks to parks system-wide.
