



# MTC Complete Streets Policy (Routine Accommodations)

- Developed in 2006 from Transportation 2030
- Review of federal, state and local policies to determine how bicycles and pedestrians are accommodated
- Bicycle and pedestrian accommodations are included in 57% of projects
- Study led to checklist for project sponsors



#### **Caltrans Deputy Directive 64-R1**

- Adopted 2008
- Provides for the needs of travelers of all ages and abilities in all planning, programming, design, construction, operations, and maintenance activities and products on the State highway system
- MTC and local policies consistent





# 2008 California Complete Streets Act (AB 1358)

- Signed by Gov. Schwarzenegger and co-sponsored by AARP and California Bicycle Coalition
- Cities and counties must include complete streets policies in general plans during any 'substantive revision of the circulation element'



### SB 375-Sustainable Communities Strategy – Plan Bay Area

- Preservation of open space and agricultural land
- Links land use and housing to transportation
- Show how development pattern and transportation network can reduce greenhouse gases



#### **One Bay Area Grant Goals**

- Integrates federal transportation program with California's climate law and the Sustainable Communities Strategy
- House all forecasted regional population demand by income levels to the year 2040
- Demonstrate achievement of greenhouse gas (GHG) emission reduction targets



#### **Complete Streets in all Cities**

- Agencies that apply to MTC for funds must have a complete streets policy
- Eventually all 101 cities in 9 counties will have either a complete streets resolution or General Plan that includes complete streets


#### **Complete Streets Policies**

- To be eligible for OBAG grant funding, cities and counties must:
  - Adopt a resolution by January 31, 2013
  - Address nine required elements
- Update the General Plan to comply with CA Complete Streets Act (2008), or
- Determine that the General Plan already complies with Complete Streets Act



#### **MTC Complete Streets Checklist**

- Required for all projects funded by MTC
- Does the project consider all users in project planning and design?
- Ten questions with many open-ended responses
- 10 to 30 minutes to complete



#### Safe Routes to School Program

- Part of a larger Climate Initiatives Program
- \$17 million over 4 years
- Distributed by the counties based on school enrollment

#### Further Support for Walk & Bike Projects

- Implementation of Complete Streets Policy
- Technical assistance with design and engineering
- Continued integration of public health/physical activity into planning



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
