




 20 pedestrian crashes within a block from Old Stadium Park

- 67 motor vehicle crashes












Results as of 12/15/18

Top Favorite Parks

Ala Wai Park, Makiki District Park, Mānoa District Park, Old Stadium Park

Visit Frequency

6% visit daily 20% visit weekly or monthly **74**% rarely or never visit

Visitors want a park where they can... Feel safe (87%), enjoy the outdoors (55%), spend time with family/friends (43%), and exercise (42%)

Current Uses

Exercise (20%), access a location across the park (18%), playground (12%)

Top Concerns

84% Safety

58% Bathroom/Facility Maint.

52% Encampments

38% Lack of Visual Appeal

90% of respondents agree that revitalizing Old Stadium Park is very or extremely important

Top Interests

- 1. Improve general park cleanliness
- 2. Renovate pavilion & bathroom facilities
- 3. Improve lighting and accessibility
- 4. Restore drinking fountains
- 5. Improve visual appeal with landscaping

Top New Features

- Picnic areas
- Adult fitness equip.
- 3. Park signage
- 4. More parking
- 5. Splash pad

Lessons Learned

- 1. Know the approval requirements (permits, approvals, etc.)
- 2. Be respectful, yet persistent with public agencies
- 3. Get key politicians involved
- 4. Show that the community supports your project
- 5. Textured traffic paint dries quickly, thin it out
- 6. When storing paint, use high-quality containers
